Passport/Visa

France can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens of Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend contacting the embassy or consulate in your country. International (non-Schengen) travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the Schengen zone. Citizens of Schengen countries can travel without a passport, but must have a valid ID with them during their stay.

Airport

The Lille-Lesquin Airport is located 7 kilometres away from the city centre. A shuttle bus service is offered and runs between the airport and the Euralille shopping centre (next to the main train station of Lille), and the journey lasts 20 minutes. Taxis can also be hired at the airport (check out this link to see the taxi firms that serve Lille Airport and some fares examples: www.lille.aeroport.fr/getting-to-the-airport/taxis).

Lille can also be reached by train or bus from Brussels, and direct bus routes exist between the Brussels South Charleroi Airport and the city of Lille (check the flibco shuttles www.flibco.com).

Public Transport

Lille has a well-developed public transportation system, managed by Transpole, comprising metro, tram, and bus lines.

Transpole has two underground lines which share the different areas of the city.

The bus service include many lines which entirely cover the city of Lille. The service also include a night line (every Thursday, Friday and Saturday night) et a shuttle for the old city (with departures every 10-15 minutes, Monday to Saturday, from 7:00 to 21:00).

Lastly, two tram lines serve nine districts of the city.

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Taxi

Mobility

The bus and in particular the shuttle from Vieux-Lille. This innovative local service offers a service to the main generators of the hyper-center, the shopping center and more distant districts of Old Lille. A shuttle every 10 to 15 minutes, Monday to Saturday, operating from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

The Subway: 2 metro lines serving 60 stations. One oar every minute during rush hour. During the week, the metro runs from 5:17 am to 0:30 am at Lille Flandres station. And on Saturday, line 1 runs for an additional hour, with a last departure at 1:30 a.m. from Lille Flandres.

Lille / Roubaix / Tourcoing tramway 2 Tramway lines which serve 36 stations in 9 municipalities in the metropolitan area. To link Lille, La Madeleine, Marcq-en-Barœul, Wasquehal, Villeneuve d'Ascq, Croix, Roubaix, Mouvaux and Tourcoing, 24 trains take turns every day from 5.35 am to 0.35 am from Lille Flandres (Frequency: a departure every 4 to 5 minutes between Lille and Croisé Laroche and 8 to 10 minutes, between Lille and Roubaix and Tourcoing)

Relay car parks to get to Lille city center, you can park your vehicle in a relay car park and take the metro (14 minutes by metro from the 4 Cantons car park and 8 minutes from the Prés car park).
