Home Security

The Christmas period can see a rise in burglaries and thefts in local community. With thieves looking to target empty properties for Christmas presents and high value goods:

1. Don't advertise any holiday details on social media.
2. Contact the local police and see if they offer a Homewatch scheme. Your CLO should have the details.
3. Where possible, have your neighbours pop round and move your mail.
4. A Wi-Fi security camera for your home can be purchased from Internet retailers and will allow you to view your home when you are away. There also wireless cameras for your front door, there are some good options for sale on Amazon which are relatively inexpensive and easy to install.



Country Advice

For those able to travel this Christmas period we must remember that although safe for tourism, certain countries hold a very real threat to military personnel. This may be from espionage, terrorism or ongoing COVID-19 restrictions. Before travelling to a country you believe may be of interest;

Anti Drink Driving Christmas 2021

In recent years, figures show that around 240 people were killed and there were around 8,680 casualties in total in drink drive accidents across UK. Although the level of drinking and driving has dropped dramatically over the last three decades, over 200 people are still killed in drink drive accidents every year. Despite 30 years of drink drive education and enforcement, over 40,000 people are still caught drink driving annually.

1. [Blood Alcohol Content Drink Driving Limits across Europe](#). The majority of European countries have a drink drive limit of 0.05%, which means drivers are allowed 0.05 grams of alcohol per 100ml of blood. That's typically the equivalent of around one beer or one small glass of wine.
