Italy in August.

August is indeed the traditional time that most Italians and southern Europeans go on their summer holiday, due to the extreme heat in this month. Most head for the beaches and mountains. Many small businesses close for the entire month. Apparently, this tradition goes way back to the days of Caesar Augustus in 27 BC. Legend has it that he wanted to combine several festivals into the month of August so he could give laborers an extended time off to rest and recover. The concept continued during the Christian period after the Roman Empire with the Church declaring August 15th as the date of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven – known in Italy as the Ferragosto. As it was also the hottest time of the year, people would take a few days prior to and after for a getaway. Today, August 15th is still a national holiday in Italy and many establishments close on this day!

What food is eaten during Ferragosto?

The cuisine of Ferragosto reflects the simplicity of summer cuisine in Italy. Dishes are generally quite fresh, with carpaccio, seafood, fresh produce and small plates of olives and cured meats and cheeses. Chicken with peppers is a popular lunch for Ferragosto, as well as a focus on vegetables as this is the month of harvesting.

Carpaccio dish – is a dish of meat or fish, thinly sliced or pounded thin, and served raw, typically as an appetizer. It was invented in 1963 by Giuseppe Cipriani from Harry's Bar in Venice, Italy and popularized during the second half of the twentieth century.



Beef carpaccio recipe:

Made with beef fillet, arugula, parmesan, lemon and olive

Ingredients:

400g beef fillet half juice of a lemon 3 tbsp olive oil 2 large handfuls of arugula/rocket Parmesan for shaving

The National Acrobatic Patrol (PAN) of the Italian Air Force was born in 1961 following the decision of the Air Force itself to create a permanent group for the training in the collective aerial acrobatics of its pilots. With 10 planes, 9 of which are in formation and 1 soloist, they are the most numerous aerobatic patrol in the world. Their flight program, including about 20 stunts lasting about half an hour, made them famous and recognised as one of the best acrobatic air patrols internationally, performing stunts all year round.

August history facts

1st 1944 – Anne Frank penned her last entry into her diary. "Keep on trying to find a way of becoming what I would like to be, and what I could be, if.... there weren't any other people living in the world". Three days later, Anne and her family were arrested and sent to Nazi concentration camps. Anne died at Bergen-Belsen concentration camp on March 15, 1945, at age 15.

2nd 1939 – Albert Einstein wrote a letter to President Franklin D. Roosevelt concerning the possibility of atomic weapons. "A single bomb of this type carried by boat and exploded in a port, might very well destroy the whole port together with some of the surrounding territory". Six years later, on August 6th 1945, the first Atomic Bomb, developed by the U.S., was dropped on the Japanese port of Hiroshima.

3rd 1492 – Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos, Spain, with 3 ships, Nina, Pinta and Santa Maria. Seeking a westerly route to the Far East, he instead landed on October 12th in the Bahamas, thinking it was an outlying Japanese island.

5th 1861 – President Abraham Lincoln signed into law the first Federal income tax, a 3% tax on incomes over \$800, as an emergency wartime measure during the Civil War. However, the tax was never actually put into effect.

9th 1974 – The second Atomic bombing of Japan occurred as an American B-29 bomber headed for the city of Kokura, but because of poor visibility then choose a secondary target, Nagasaki. About noon, the bomb detonated killing an estimated 70,000 people and destroying half the city.

13th 1961 – The Berlin Wall came into existence after the East German government closed the border between East and West.

16th 1896 - Gold was discovered in Rabbit Creek, a tributary of the Klondike River in Alaska, resulting in the Great Klondike Gold Rush.

Think that's enough history for now!! Phew!
