



Have you already had your 2nd booster shot?

The Belgian COVID-19 Autumn vaccination campaign started on **12 September 2022**. Certain sectors and immunodeficient people are being vaccinated first and then an **age-based logic will be applied until the age of 18**. This campaign is **including the new (EMA approved) bivalent mRNA vaccines against Omicron!**

If you already have a BIS or NISS number¹ you will receive an invitation to get your 2nd booster shot. You just need to make an appointment (through the website mentioned in the invitation) and choose one of the vaccination centres around SHAPE (open Monday to Friday):

If you do not receive an invitation or you do not have a BIS or NISS number yet, from 19 Sep on, you can visit the SOIGNIES Centre. They will help you obtain a BIS or NISS number and/or will administer a vaccine.

This autumn campaign is also the opportunity to encourage anybody who hasn't yet received a basic COVID-19 vaccination to get their initial dose or a first booster shot (same procedure).

NOTE:

- Individuals that lack their 1st booster are not considered protected.
- A minimum of 3 months (ideally 6) should lapse between the two boosters.
