What is the Brunssum International Club and why would I join?

The Brunssum International Club (BIC) is open to all NATO ID holders and spouses. It meets monthly for Coffee and Culture mornings, hosted by different delegations. There's usually a short presentation / activity / quiz, followed by coffee and food from the host delegation and finally, a raffle. BIC offers a limited number of childcare places for a small additional fee.

Regardless of whether you're a member, we would love your support at the next Coffee and Culture morning, hosted by the UK delegation on 1 November. You don't have to be a member to attend, so you can come along with no strings attached!


