Getting your boiler ready for winter

It's never too early to check that your boiler is prepared for the winter months.

To help you ensure that your central heating system is working to its full capacity, DIO have put together some advice to help you safely test your boiler.

Testing your boiler:


- 1. Turn on your central heating system
- 2. Turn the room thermostat right up, making sure that the boiler turns on. Don't forget to turn the thermostatic valves on your radiators up too
- 3. Wait 5-10 minutes. Carefully use your hand to check all the radiators in your home are warming up and there are no cold spots
- 4. Turn your thermostat down and get to know how the timer and room thermostat for your central heating system work
- 5. Do you know how to bleed your radiator? Contact your Estate Manager for advice or assistance.
- 6. Consider having your heating on a constant low temperature (18°C) to prevent damp and condensation

If you spot any issues with your boiler or central heating system, please report your fault via the DIO Fault reporting system to log a repair as soon as possible.




