## Carnivall

Did you know that Carnival officially starts on the 11 of November?!

Carnival traditions across the Netherlands vary, with distinct differences between the north and south of the country. Here in the south of Limburg, public life is suspended for a few days, and everything revolves around the Carnival. While many old traditions slowly disappear and are swallowed up by more commercial events, the Carnival continues to grow. Although the religious importance is increasingly eroded, the Limburg carnival culture is developing steadily.

Carnival is three days where people distance themselves from the everyday humdrum and rational world and replace it with the irrational and unusual. However, while all the parties might seem like chaos, Carnival in the Dutch province of Limburg is highly ritualised. For example, in some towns, power is symbolically handed over to the prince of the celebration and his Council of Eleven. This ritual symbolically moves the town out of the everyday rational world and into the world of Carnival – a bit like Alice going to Wonderland!

The council and the prince are cultural mediators of the festivities. The Council of Eleven is steeped in symbolism. Their bicorne hats are inspired by the hats worn by jesters and symbolise the foolishness that is central to the Carnival. Every member of the council and the prince wears a chain that symbolises their unity. The regalia of the prince, his sceptre, feathers and other distinguishing features express his symbolic power of the three days of folly.

The most common aspect of Carnival in most cultures worldwide are the costumes worn by the revellers. They replace their real identity for a temporary one, usually signifying a connection with the bizarre world of insane. The outfit is a 'mask' behind which revellers can hide their everyday identity to celebrate Carnival without shame. Although revellers hide their personal identity behind the 'mask', it is, in fact, an expression of their individuality. People take great care choosing their temporary identity, and some express themselves in very individual creations.

However you choose to celebrate Carnival—have a great time, stay safe and share your photos with us!


