Liquorice as candy

A real Dutch treat. You either love it or hate it.

Liquorice is a sweet made from the juice extracted from the root of the Glycyrrhiza Glabra, which belongs to the Fabaceae family. The liquorice many (but not all) of us know and love today is made from this juice, which is then combined with sugar, a binding agent and a base of acacia gum, gelatine or similar.

The Netherlands boasts the highest per capita consumption of liquorice in the world, with each person eating more than 4 pounds (2000 grams) per year! Although the Dutch (as well as Scandinavians and Germans) love black liquorice, many people do not enjoy the taste, especially the salty varieties.


