#### **EJSU Volunteers**

Why do we need them?- Each EJSU led event means that we need registered volunteers. These registered volunteers ensure that each event is ran safely. The main reason is to also safeguard children, young adults and vulnerable people. Becoming a volunteer does not mean you will have to plan an event on your own, the main reason is to make sure events are running safely rather than you need to plan a fancy event. For any EJSU event with children or vulnerable people present we need x2 registered volunteers.

Who can be a volunteer? – All service personnel and spouses can be volunteers.

#### What do I need to do to become a registered volunteer?-

- 1) A registration form- Completed with the CLO
- 2) A safeguarding course level one- approx. 30 minutes
- 3) Complete a DBS form and ID documents- to obtain a EJSU Volunteer DBS clearance and Certificate
- 4) Optional add on training is available.

## Benefits of becoming a registered volunteer-

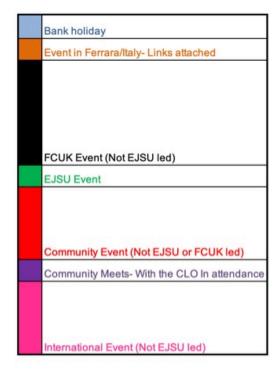
- Fills in an employment gap on your CV

# Michael's fundraiser for The Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund

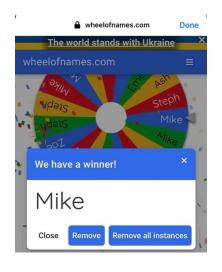

#### Review-

My recommendation this month is Osteria degli Adelardi.
I went with my mum and it was lovely. We walked in without a reservation (on a Tuesday) and had two courses. We both had the aubergine flan with a tomato and pesto coulis which was delicious. I then had a bluefin tuna steak with a sesame crust, a mango salsa and an orange and fennel salad on the side. The tuna was excellently cooked - rare in the middle - and the salad pairing was light and fresh. They seem to change their menu regularly as I had a different tuna dish last time.

My mum had a very generous portion of beef carpaccio with a ginger coulis (or something) which she very much enjoyed. All in, the meal was €71 with a glass of wine so mid range price wise.

"If you or your relative is overseas either on a posting, at sea or on a deployment and you need to apply for his/her return on compassionate grounds (for example if there is a death in your immediate family, serious illness or a serious family crisis) contact the Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre (JCCC) immediately. # Welfare Referral Form

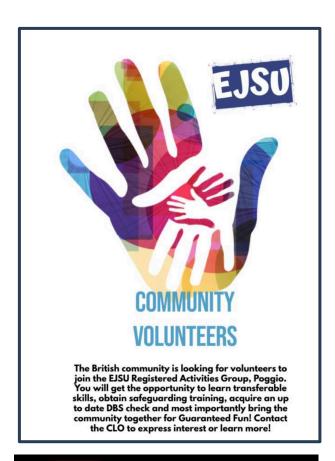
There is now a live 'Referral Form' available on EJSU.net for any Welfare and/or Pastoral issues.

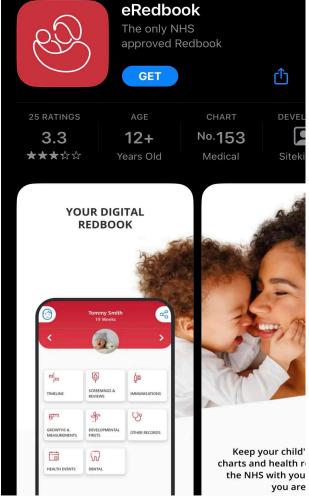

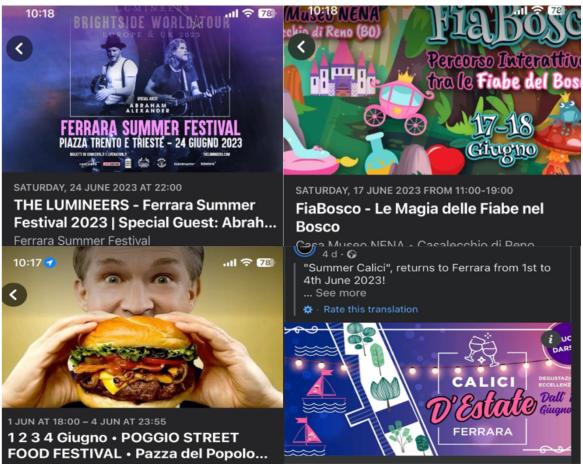

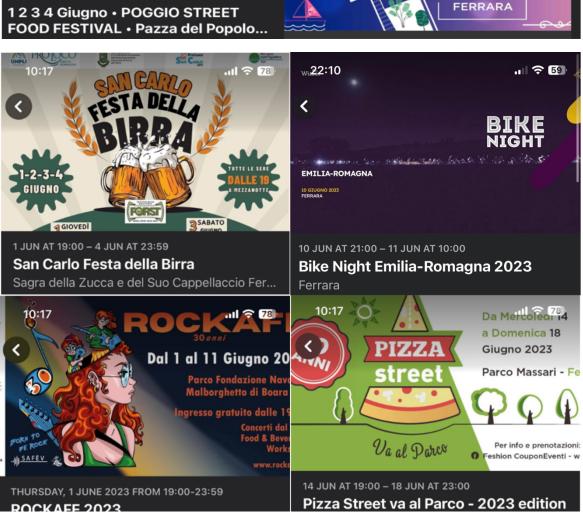
